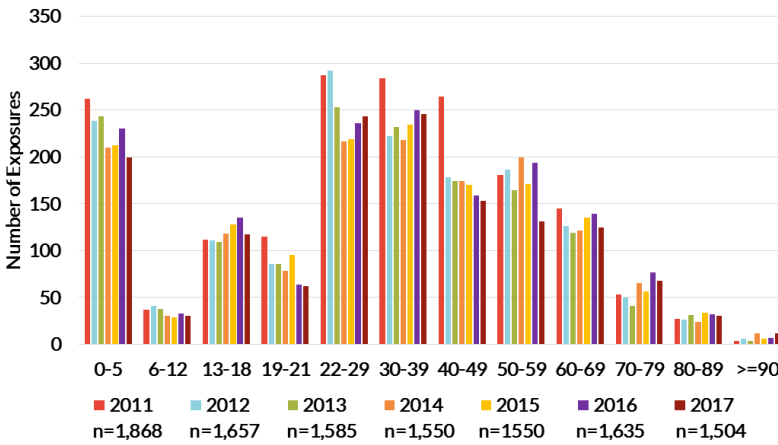
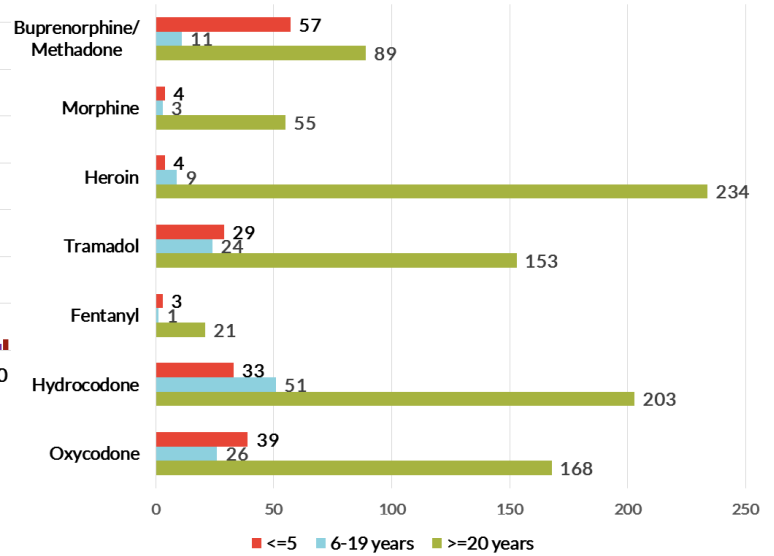


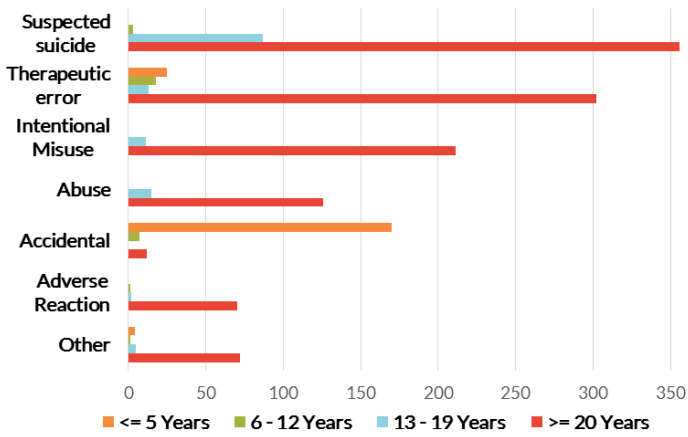
Opioid Exposures By Age from 2011-2017



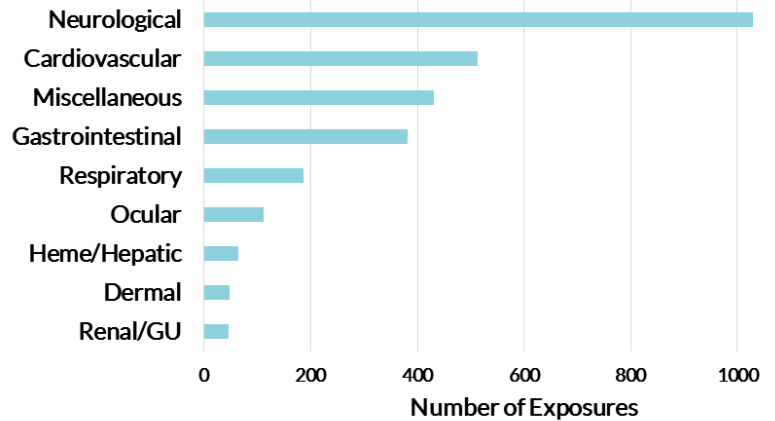
Specific Exposures to Opioid Substances



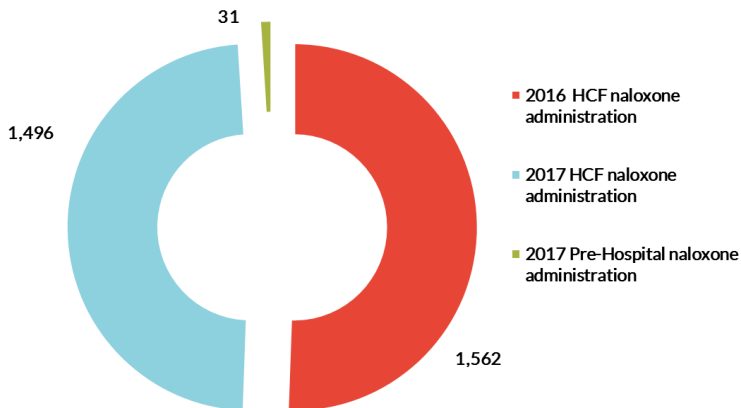
Opioid Exposure Reason 2017

Doses of Naloxone (NARCAN®) Administered



35.5% of individuals exposed to opioids developed moderate or life-threatening symptoms.

68.4% of patients who called the poison center first, were managed by our Specialists at home, keeping them out of the emergency department, saving \$357,320 of our patients' dollars.

In 2015, law passed for naloxone to be administered by the public. In 2017, WAPC began to track naloxone administration prior to arrival at HCF. In 2017, 2% (n=31) doses were given before arrival.
